Public Discussion on the Work of the Police Inspectorate of Kosovo

As part of the UNMIK-funded project "Advancing Human Rights through Increased Public Awareness," on March 7, 2024, at the Civic Energy Center (CEC) in North Mitrovica, a public discussion was held with representatives of the Police Inspectorate of Kosovo (PIK).

The discussion aimed to deepen the understanding of the PIK's work at the local level, especially from the perspective of affected communities living in northern Kosovo.

The discussion was attended by Mr. Arber Beka, Chief of the Division for Public Relations and International Cooperation, the Police Inspectorate of Kosova, Mr. Zoran Ristić, the Investigator at the Investigation Department, Mr. Jerome Bouyjou, Head of Human Rights Section at UNMIK, Mr. Dušan Radaković from ACDC, media representatives, civil society representatives, UNMIK, EULEX, KFOR, embassy representatives, and citizens.

PIK representatives presented their mission and scope of work since its establishment in 2006. They emphasized PIK's responsibility in ensuring an accountable, democratic, and transparent police service under Kosovo legislation. The discussion covered a wide range of PIK activities, including prevention, detection, and investigation of crimes committed by Kosovo Police employees, as well as inspection of police structures and functions.

Final Conference of the project "Promoting Interethnic Dialogue in Local Government"

As part of the project "Promoting Interethnic Dialogue in Local Government" implemented by the NGO ACDC with the support of the National Endowment for Democracy (NED) a public discussion was held on March 28th at Civil Energy Center at North Mitrovica.

Ther panelists included Executive Director of the NGO ACDC Dušan Radaković, The Deputy President of the local assembly in North Mitrovica, Skender Sadiku and Deputy Prime Minister of Kosovo, Emilija Redžepi.

Dušan Radaković emphasized during his address that this project started two years ago and that despite numerous problems and challenges in the field, the project has been successfully implemented.

Deputy Prime Minister of Kosovo, Emilija Redžepi, said she believes that building trust and the participation of minority communities in political life are key to solving the problems of all communities and that this should be fought for through institutions.

Within the project, several initiatives have been implemented. One such initiative included the organization of the play titled "With What, With Whom in the EU???" by author and director Dragan Tešić and it was performed at the Cultural Center Kadri Kadriu and Private Cultural Center "Akvarijus."

The play aimed to bring together people from different communities to enjoy a shared cultural experience, connecting the two cultural centers and supporting cultural diversity.

> The Ombudsperson, Naim Qelaj and his deputy, Srdjan Sentic, met representatives of civil society organizations as well as representatives of local authorities of the Mitrovica region. The meeting was organised by NGO ACDC and supported by UNMIK.

> The Ombudsperson, Naim Qelaj spoke about the cases that have been handled by him for the complaints brought in the last meeting with the NGOs in North Mitrovica, the issues that are under the jurisdiction of the Ombudsperson's Institution (OI).

> On the other hand, representatives of non-governmental organizations raised some of the issues such as non-respect of the law on languages by the authorities, the issue of the property of some returned families of the Serbian community in the municipality of Klina, the issue of the Abbot of the Monastery in Zveçan, as well as the issue regarding the equipment of citizens of the north of the country with documents of Kosovo.

> Such meetings aim to facilitate cooperation between the Ombudsperson's Institution and civil society organizations, whose main goal is to increase awareness, cooperation, and general promotion of human rights.
